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# Napa Valley College <br> CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSTY GENERAL EDUCATION (GE) REQUIREMENTS Effective Fall 2005 through Summer 2006 

## CSU Admission Requirements:

A Napa Valley College student who is planning to transfer to one of the campuses of the CSU system may qualify for admission by meeting the following requirements:

Lower Division Transfer: (1-59 transferable semester units) Undergraduate transfer applicants with fewer than 59 transferable semester units may qualify foradmission if they:

- Meet the eligibility index required of freshman
- Successfully completed necessary courses to make up deficiencies from high school if the 15 unit pattem of college preparatory subjects were not completed.
- Maintained at least a 2.0 g.p.a. in college transferable course work
- Are in good standing at the last college attended, i.e. are eligible to re-enroll.

NOTE: Contact the campus of choice to determine whether there are limits on admission as a lower division transfer.
Upper Division Transfer: (60 or more transferable semester units) Students who will transfer with 60 or more transferable semesterunits may fulfill admission requirements by:

- Completing a minimum of 30 semester units with a " $C$ " or better in each course, to include:
- Courses that satisfy CSU GE Areas A-1, Oral Communication; A-2, Written Communication; A-3, Critical Thinking; and B-4, Mathematics/ Quantitative Reasoning
- Additional CSU transferable courses from Physical Universe; Life Forms; Mathematics; Arts and Humanities; and Social and Behavioral Sciences of at least equivalent level to courses that meet general education requirements.

NOTE: Students are advised to complete as many of the lower division requirements for their major as possible prior to transfer. Admission to some majors at some CSU campuses may have additional requirements beyond those listed in this section. Consult with a counselor for details on your major. Although not required for admission to the CSU, students are encouraged to complete 60 transferable units and an Associates Degree prior to transfer

## CSU Graduation Requirements:

Most CSU campuses have graduation requirements in addition to general education requirements that may be taken at NVC prior to transfer. They include but are not limited to:

- Foreign Language
- Second Semester English Composition
- Ethnic Studies/Multicultural
- Computer Competency
